

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Problem

With a large number of people, limited time, and limited space, it is very challenging to schedule all the necessary AR meetings while avoiding conflicts, ensuring a single source of truth, and presenting accurate itineraries to participants.

Opportunity

Many ARInsights customers share similar needs for scheduling meetings and events. Further increase the value of ARchitect by adding features to meet these needs.

Solution

ARInsights added Event Manager to ARchitect for Oracle with the following features:

- Manage meeting invites (yes, no, maybe)
- Schedule 1:1s for analysts and executives/spokespeople
- Create itineraries/agendas for analysts and executives/spokespeople





Problem

AR Managers need to schedule more event meetings than ever while avoiding conflicts for their participants and location bookings. Challenging to do with Event Manager.

Event managers challenged to make efficient use of limited meeting spaces.

Opportunity

Further enhance the capabilities of ARchitect Event Manager so that AR teams planning large events can do it all in ARchitect and avoid the need for a separate booking and logistics platform.

Solution

ARInsights delivered a 2022 update to ARchitect Event Manager with the following new features:

- Visual calendar view on the Interaction Screen to ease finding meeting times when there will be no conflicts
- Multi-slot locations



Using the Multi-Slot Location Feature to Track Room Inventory

- 1. Challenge this addressed:
 - Repeated trial and error to find an open meeting space.
- 2. Assigned *types of rooms* through interactions, and waited to assign *specific* room numbers the night before each event day.
 - Allows us to ensure that logistics of room allocation makes sense
 - Makes finding an open room much easier than before

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Best Practices & Lessons Learned

Best Practices

- Evaluate your team's needs each time, long before the event. Interview team members, understand their pain points, and how these points have evolved.
 - Gives you time to either strategize around challenges, or work with ARInsights through product enhancements.
- Set ground rules and share them often.
- Hold office hours regularly leading up to the event for your team to get help or ask questions.
- Assign 1-2 people to QC all entries throughout the event lifecycle.
- Check scheduled meetings the night before each event day, and the morning of as well to catch any last-minute changes.

Lessons Learned

- QC of meeting scheduling is critical the more diligent you are with QC ahead of time, the smoother the event will run.
- ARInsights is there to help If you come across a challenge at *any* point in the event planning process, just ask!
 - ARInsights has surprised us many times with addressing asks we thought were too ambitious. At the least, they will help you with a workaround and note the challenge for future product enhancements anyways.
